TEENAGER Kirsteen Lupton has won the heart of Hollywood superstar Jude Law with her bravery and fantastic fundraising.

Born with her bladder outside her body, the 13-year-old needed emergency surgery when she was just hours old and has endured 15 major operations.

And after winning her fight for life, she raised £750,000 for the hospital that saved her – including an incredible **£20,000 IN 10 MINUTES** by auctioning her own signature.

Now Kirsteen, daughter of Milngavie checkout assistant Jill Lupton, has written a book – and she has just received the front cover back from the printers.

She has suffered terrible pain and will need a catheter for the rest of her life.

But, undaunted, this amazing young woman from Glasgow kept smiling and remained confident and bubbly – determined to raise money as a thank you to Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH).

And Jude, who presented Kirsteen with a Tesco-sponsored Daily Mirror Pride of Britain award for Fundraiser of the Year, has paid tribute to Scotland's bonnie battler. He told *The One* this week: "Kirsteen's story is one that gives inspiration and hope to eve-

ryone and I felt honoured and privileged to present her with the award."

The ceremony at London Television Centre was watched by seven-million TV viewers, and superband McFly gave her a signed guitar. The then Prime Minister, Tony Blair, was so impressed he invited Kirsteen to Downing Street the following day in 2006.

Kirsteen's memoirs – *Pride of Britain*, pictured above – even have a foreword by TV maths wizard Carol Vorderman.

Mum Jill, 48, has been ill herself, undergoing a triple heart-bypass in October, and hopes to return to work later this spring.

Kirsteen, from Glasgow, said: "Because I've grown up seeing so many sick children, it makes me stronger to help raise money as a thank-you to the hospital. I want to be a doctor and would love to work there."

Her fundraising heroics include modelling at fashion shows, public speaking at corporate functions and giving her school play proceeds to the hospital. She's donating the proceeds from the book to GOSH.
